FAITH TALKS BACK

KEY TRUTHS

There is no such thing as passive victory for a christian. We have entered into spiritual warfare and we have to resist the devil. When he shows up he likes to be camouflaged so we think his ideas are for our benefit.

Time and time again we learn in the Bible that God is not the author of sickness and disease. The enemy is the one who brings all things against us that oppose the word and the kingdom of God.

Job was the richest man in the east and he feared God. Satan attacked him and first went after his finances, second he went after his family, and third, his health. After this we learn that Job blamed God for all the wrong that happened in his life. But we know from reading further in the word that it's the enemy that comes to steal,

kill, and destroy, not God. By the end of the book, Job finally ran to God instead of blaming him for what was happening in his life and God blessed him greatly.

Worry is fear in its infancy, when it grows it can become very powerful. Fear is faith in reverse and can open a door for the enemy to come in.

The law says that when one rule is broken, the whole law is broken. Everyone has done wrong and needs a savior.

PRACTICAL APPLICATION

“Why do bad things happen to good people?”

- Sometimes it's just the devil. Other times it's the law of sowing and reaping. Sometimes it's a result of bad decisions.

Don't run from God, run to God.

- God isn't the source of the problems, he is the answer.

The enemy uses the words from our mouths against us.

- We are supposed to say what God says about us. If we can turn our believing and our mouths around, we can turn our lives around. The power lies in consistently speaking the truth.

In the story of David and Goliath, the two come face to face and Goliath's tongue rises up against David as he tells him he stands no chance.

- David responded with his words, telling his enemy that God is on his side and that he will be defeated
- David had the last word with Goliath and we should also have the last word with the enemy.

The spirit of faith is believing in your heart and saying it with your mouth.

- Let your report and the words you speak say what God says you can have. We should believe it and say it.
- Jesus spoke to the sea, the waves, the wind, demons, sickness, and disease. Then he tells us that we will do more than what he did.
